



Crossroads for Women

Annual Report--2010

The Crossroads Supportive Housing Program

- 49 women were served in 2010 in The Crossroads permanent supportive housing program.
- 42 children were served in 2010 who were in the custody of their mothers or were in the process of reuniting with them.

The age breakdown of the women was:

18-29:	20%
30-50:	73%
Over 50:	6%

The racial and ethnic breakdown was:

Hispanic:	47%
Anglo:	29%
African/Amer.:	4%
Native Amer.:	20%

The housing before entry was:

Jail/Prison:	2%
Short term Treatment Program:	6%
Streets:	24%
Emergency shelter:	10%
Domestic Violence Shelter:	4%
Transitional Housing Program:	54%

- Twenty-three women left the program in 2010, of those, 17 women moved into permanent housing.
- Over 90% of the women who came from transitional housing, were in jail or prison before that.

The Maya's Place Program

47 women were served in 2010.

The age breakdown was:

18-29:	34%
30-49:	60%
Over 50:	6%

The racial and ethnic breakdown was:

Hispanic:	60%
Anglo:	20%
African/Amer.:	2%
Native Amer.:	18%

The housing before entry was:

Jail:	79%
Prison:	11%
Other:	10%

- 12 women graduated from Maya's Place in 2010 and 10 of them entered The Crossroads permanent supportive housing program.
- Of the women in the program in 2010, 20 (42%) either successfully completed or were still in the program as of 12/31/10

Metropolitan Detention Center

- Life skills education provided for approximately 550 women through our weekly group at the treatment unit of the Metropolitan Detention Center.
- Approximately 40% of the women who have been served at Maya's Place or The Crossroads began receiving our services in jail providing the continuum of care that was envisioned.
